aving a Braille Bible at home is great if you are Brianna Fejita, one of Creekside's former *Hearts in Motion* kiddos. But as you can imagine, it is too large to bring back and forth to church because it must be printed in several volumes rather than in one book!

In March 2015 Creekside Staffers wanted to find ways to help fifth grade Brianna engage in discussion-time with the other children by looking up Scripture. They reached out to an organization called Lutheran Braille Writers (LBW), which is run by volunteers who make and bind each New Testament volume one at a time. Every so often, as they completed a volume, they sent it to Creekside completely free of charge. It has been a long process—more than three years—to receive the complete New Testament in Braille.

In addition to the New Testament volumes, "mysterious" packages continued arriving from LBW. *Mysterious* because nothing in these packages was marked for the sighted! Over time, three smaller "books" and a dozen stapled packets had accumulated.

To solve the mystery, in June, Creekside's Youth Staff brought together Brianna, who is now an incoming freshman, and Connie Bateman, another visually impaired Creeksider, and they worked side-by-side with Staff to identify and label (for the sighted) what the Braille pages said. Brianna and Connie identified the smaller "books" as calendars and the stapled packets as newsletters full of inspirational quotes and antidotes, similar to *Guideposts*.

Our new, evolving Braille library has become a valuable resource at Creekside and is now available in the Youth Office so that others with visual impairment can read God's Word!

HEARTS MOTION

Creekside's Special Needs Ministry intended for children (Kindergarten through 6th Grade) with developmental and medical disabilities. It is primarily provided so that parents/guardians may attend service and feel their child is being well cared for.




On Celebration Sunday, June 10, 2018, we learned that over the past 12 months Creekside is showing healthy signs of LIFE!

never run a marathon, but a quick Google search tells me it might take as little as 16-20 weeks of training to prepare myself for this grueling competition. Runnersworld.com says that the key is consistency. Apparently, even couch potatoes like me can become accustomed to running long distances if we strengthen our core and start with an easy pace at shorter distances several times a week. Over time, as we build strength and endurance, we will be able to run further and faster until race day arrives.

In many ways, the Christian life is like a marathon. Joining God's family as a believer in Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is easy. Living our day-to-day lives to honor him is not quite so easy. Like runners training for a race, we need to stretch and train our spiritual muscles so that we have the stamina to run strong and finish well.

The good news is that all the training equipment we need is

easy to find and simple for anyone to use, whether we've been following Christ all our lives or just a short while. What are these tools, you ask? We start with the basics: Prayer and Bible reading. These two habits form the basis for every aspect of Christian living, and at Creekside we want to equip you well so that you can grow stronger in your faith.

If you're not really sure how to pray, we offer a Learning to Pray Workshop that will teach you to pray as Jesus taught his disciples. Do you feel like your prayer life is stale and you want to go a little deeper in your conversations with God? Then you might want to spend a Saturday morning at our Prayer Workshop here on campus, or you may want to plan for a whole weekend in Prayer Renewal Retreat at the beautiful Camp Del Oro in the Sierra foothills.

Our other basic training tool is the Bible, God's written Word to all people. Are you new to the Bible? Wondering where it came from, how it's put together, and why we can trust it? Our threeweek Getting Comfortable with the Bible Workshop will answer all your questions and give you some basics so you can confidently begin reading and studying. Once you start reading the Bible, you might find that you want to know and understand more. Attending one of our many Bible Studies or

joining a LifeGroup will help you connect with others who can help you along your journey.

So, are you wondering, "Why would anyone ever want to train for a marathon?" or "Why do I need to spend time in prayer or Bible study?" Just like we want fit bodies, we need strong, healthy spirits. Spending time in daily prayer makes it easy to turn to God when we are going through crises. As we see Him answer prayers, we have confidence that He hears us and cares about us. Reading His Word gives us instructions for living and answers life's tough questions. The Bible is full of wisdom about marriage, childrearing, work relationships, friendships, money, and much more. But most importantly, it tells us the complete story of God's love for us, and that's a story we need to be reminded of every day.

We're now about two years down the road and it feels like we're finally seeing progress:


- We've now raised nearly \$1.1 million dollars toward our goal—thank you!—and the permitting process has begun with the City of Elk Grove.

CREEKSIDE PASTORS ANSWER DIFFICULT QUESTIONS:

How do I read the Bible to become a better disciple and build my character?

t's an exciting time to be at Creekside Christian Church. People from all kinds of backgrounds are coming through our doors. Some people know a lot about God and the Bible; for some people it's all completely new to them. It is clear that God is drawing people to Himself, taking people where they are, and doing fresh new things in their lives as they come to know and love Him.

RECOGNIZE GOD EXISTS. Most people, if they are honest, recognize there is a God; in fact, it's harder to believe there is not a God—His fingerprints are everywhere: from the smallest cell to the vast reaches of the Universe. PSALM 19:1 says "The heavens declare the glory of God!" Clearly, God is there.

To acknowledge God exists is a huge first step. So many people have theories about God. To actually understand what God says about Himself makes an even greater difference in our lives. In the Bible, God specifically reveals things about Himself, and through Jesus, we see the character and love of God.

SPEND TIME WITH JESUS. Who better than God, the One who wired you, can meet the deepest needs of your heart? Only God can help your soul find the meaning that it actually craves. The character of who we spend time with often rubs off on us. When we spend time with Jesus, our own characters definitely change for the better. We become more like Jesus.

READ WITH AN OPEN HEART. When you study the Bible, you may feel you are on a treasure hunt of sorts, and maybe you will come to say as the writer of PSALM 119:161 once said, "My heart stands in awe of Thy words. I rejoice at Thy word, as one who finds great treasure."

Reading the Bible grips those who read it with an open, honest, hungry heart. In a world increasingly full of conflicting messages, challenges and instability, it's such a relief to find an anchor for our souls.



Your heart was created for God. Come eager to learn and grow. God wants to be found by you. God wants to meet you right where you are. 👊







ports are an incredible tool in personal development... and are just fun! Thinking back though, there were times (shocking as it is) that I "lost my cool" or let my integrity slip on the field. I recognized that this stemmed from what I valued most in those moments...winning.

Healthy enjoyment of sports and competition can so easily get clouded when higher value is placed on winning or personal accomplishments. We—as family, friends, teammates, coaches, or role models—must keep focused on what's truly important when it comes to athletics because we so quickly influence what this next generation values. And as a result, what character will be developed through sports and life.

Winning is fun, winning is great, I mean, the Gospel stems from Jesus's victory over death but in sports winning cannot be everything. That has to be kept in perspective. Sports so often don't go your way and when winning is the primary focus frustration, outbursts, pride, and entitlement can crowd out godly character and integrity. Instead, we can train the next generation to have an eternal focus, ingrain values that go beyond athletics.

Jesus makes two truths very clear which ought to shape our values: growing a deeply connected relationship with the Father and loving people with the same love we've experienced. These truths should set the foundation of our homes by being known, repeated, encouraged, and demonstrated. Modeling this is crucial because when it comes to spiritual guidance and teaching character, as a mentor of mine once said, "you can't lead others in what you aren't practicing yourself".

If these values/commands are at the root of EVERYTHING we do, we will start to view sports differently. They become more than opportunities to enjoy competition, camaraderie, and the sport itself but also are a platform to value people and display the Lord's character, especially in the critical moments. Let's start the trend and see beyond bad calls, beyond the competition, and enjoy sports in a way that honors the God we claim to serve whether we're on the field or in the stands.


