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FROM FOREIGN COUNTRIES TOOUR OWN "BACKYARD"

Once again the people of Creekside have generously impacted people in so many places in so many ways.

Typhoon Haiyan struck the PHILIPPINES in November, 2013, just five short years ago. Pastor Scott and Karen Stoneburner recently traveled to the Philippines to see the results of the generosity and to attend services there. The \$25,000 donated by Creeksiders was enough to rebuild the church in Tacloban, Philippines.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD exceeded expectations and blessed more children in countries across the world with "shoeboxes" full of toys and supplies, sent with prayer.

Sunday donationsat-the-exit-door exceeded \$7,000 in November to help victims of the CAMP FIRE in Paradise, CA.

And, through the SHARE-A-SOLE event, Creekside blessed five of 23 local schools with 912 pairs of shoes.


⁶⁶One of the ways to get to know really who they are, is to connect with what is going on in their culture. Be the one who will start that initial point of connection to initiate further discussion.

Can they be connected?

od calls us to love our neighbors as ourselves. Hmmm... how can we ever do this, if we don't even *know* our neighbors!?

It's easy to move at such a fast pace that we don't take time to slow down and visit. Jim and I have some new neighbors in our very eclectic neighborhood, and many of them have a completely different culture and faith base than we do. Before we can ever love them like Jesus, we need to get to know them.

We are taking small, but very intentional, steps to engage with our neighbors. Instead of driving into the garage and dropping the door, we are leaving the door up and lingering a bit. When a neighbor is outside as we drive home, we don't just wave: now we stop and talk with them.

When we see a neighbor go to the mailbox, we also go get our mail and invite conversation. Our children are raised and no longer home, but when kids are on the street playing, we go out to encourage them. These small but intentional steps help us build relationships and a bridge to sharing our faith.

You might be thinking that life is too super full and who really has time to reach out to others, possibly even strangers, who may or may not know Christ?

Well, one of our LifeGroups recently reached out, and I hope their story encourages and challenges you! bout a year ago we had new neighbors move in next door to us. When we saw them moving in, we went over to introduce ourselves to see if we could help with anything. Immediately we understood that they were not Christian, but rather Muslims. But that did not matter to us.

We went over to talk with them every day for several days and expressed interest in them, observing how we could help. After being invited in to their home we realized that the house had not been kept up and was a wreck. We told them we would love to help them and had a group of friends who would also be willing to help. Our neighbors thought that that would be wonderful.

The next week at our LifeGroup meeting, we shared this story with the group. Our leaders and group members were excited about the opportunity to serve. We told our new neighbors and set a date.

For most of a Saturday, eight of our LifeGroup team cleaned walls, lights and floors. We painted an entire living and dining room and even chopped down a tree. In one day we made a huge difference in their home and had a great time working together. Our neighbors were blown away that people they didn't even know would come to their home and spend a day off helping them!

Since then we have continued the relationship, and the woman has even attended our church once! My wife had dinner with this couple when I was out of town, and she talked to them about the Bible, Abraham, Isaac, Ishmael and Jesus Christ. We truly believe that God has used our LifeGroup in a profound way to help teach our new friends about Himself. God is working in the lives of our neighbors and we are privileged to be a part of that!

As a LifeGroup, you can also be on the lookout for opportunities to serve others. Some groups even invite their neighbors to join them! Talk and pray with your LifeGroup, then make a plan to each "do something neighborly." Hold each other accountable! Maybe one of these ideas will help you get started:

- Take a welcome gift to a new neighbor
- Host a gathering... holiday, Super Bowl or block party
- Invite a neighbor to your house for a meal
- Walk your neighborhood and engage in conversation
- Identify one or two neighbors who are not yet believers and pray often for them

LifeGroups provide an opportunity for the Holy Spirit to do His incredible work. Our next LifeGroup session

will run January 27 through April 7, 2019. If you are not yet in a LifeGroup, we encourage you to sign up for one—in the atrium or on-line every Sunday in January. See page 19 for more details.

LifeGroups help us grow in our relationship with Jesus and with others. LifeGroups help us become bolder in our faith. It's my prayer that you will ask your group and the Lord to help you see ways to invite, encourage or serve your neighbors.

Together, we can make a difference! May you be encouraged as you step out in faith and build relationships both inside and outside of your LifeGroups! ^{CL}

Winter Gingerbread Trifle

1/2 cup packed brown sugar 1/3 teaspoon cinnamon 1 (30 oz) can pumpkin pie filling 1 package instant vanilla pudding mix 2 (14 oz) packages gingerbread mix 1 (12 oz) carton frozen topping (such as Cool Whip) 1 cup gingersnaps (broken up)

Bake the gingerbread according to the package directions; cool completely. Meanwhile, prepare the pudding and set aside. Stir the pumpkin pie filling, sugar Directions: and cinnamon into the pudding. Crumble 1 batch of gingerbread into the bottom of a large, clear bowl. Pour 1/2 of the pudding mixture over the gingerbread, then add a layer of whipped cream. Repeat with the remaining gingerbread, pudding, and whipped cream. Sprinkle the top with crushed gingersnaps if desired. Refrigerate overnight. You can also prepare this recipe in to-go containers... perfect for sharing

with your neighbors!



feared the

floodwaters might reach my house. Record rainfall drenched the Sacramento area in January-February, 2017.

The downpour cascaded to my end of the block causing leaves and debris to plug the storm drains. By evening residents were forced to park their cars above the flooded street corner and walk across my yard to their homes. News footage of the train derailment near Highway 99 in south Elk Grove weighed on my mind.

In the dark, cold, and drizzle I pulled at anything my rake could latch onto. I was determined to keep the drains at my corner and across the street unobstructed.

In time a neighbor, whom I'd never met, trekked toward me hat on head and rake in hand. She ventured from the cul-de-sac at the other end of the street seeking other drains to conquer. "Do you think this is how Noah got his start?" I said in jest. She chuckled, but as we continued on our task she mentioned she attended Creekside Church. I was already a believer, but had stopped going to church because I struggled with a long, dry season of shaky confidence in the Lord. The falling raindrops contrasted with my parched faith. My newfound neighbor lent a sympathetic ear and prayed over me.

Shortly after midnight our efforts were rewarded by the surging flow of water into the unplugged storm drains. Our street was clear once again. In the weeks after I began to attend Creekside Church.

My neighbor had reached out to me through service, which is just one way to engage in "*The Art* of *Neighboring*." Looking at your fellow residents from a perspective of care and service may inspire you to develop friendships with them.

Some of us don't possess the social ease to reach out. It's natural to feel afraid when approaching someone we don't know.



My advice: be prayerful and ask God for the strength to make the first move. Often relationships start with a smile and a wave. Many neighbors are just as hesitant and would welcome the opportunity to connect on a personal level.

Here are some easy things you can do to break the ice:

- Linger a little longer in your yard. As people happen by, greet them with a simple hello.
- At the cluster mailbox, comment, "I hope the check's in the mail instead of more bills."
- When walking your dog, "I love what you've done with your flowerbed."
- As you relax on your porch or front area, "Nice weather we're having.

When Jesus said, "Love your neighbors," He meant inclusive of everyone, despite our different backgrounds. Our neighborhoods are multi-ethnic just like the schools our kids attend. We can take a cue from our children, who on the playground, see beyond external differences and only see potential friends.

Aside from cultural differences our neighborhoods may be comprised of younger or older people, single and divorced people, single parents, those from different

s o c i o e c o n o m i c backgrounds or of various religious preferences.

As you

build relationships you will find we lead the same lives and have many of the same concerns about paying our mortgages, keeping our jobs, and hopes for our families.

As you get to know your neighbors...

...perhaps you can build relationships as follows:

- Host a Backyard Cookout. Barbecues bring people together. Some of your neighbors may already know people from other households to invite.
- Attend meetings such as HOA, Neighborhood Watch, or community projects. You'll learn of your neighbors' concerns and their hopes.
- Host a play date with other stay-at-home moms or dads. What a great way to get to know each other while your kids are playing on the swings?
- Hold a Super Bowl party. Gather around for one of the most popular sporting events in America to cheer your favorite teams.
- Give produce from your garden or baked goods from your oven. It's always easy to say, "I had extra and thought you might like these."

The Art of Neighboring is not about targeting specific households, Bible in hand, to impose a faith agenda. Forced conversations about faith could derail budding relationships. As you come to know one another, you will have opportunities to share your faith in ways that are appropriate and authentic.

You may not have the same spiritual beliefs as others, but God favors establishing relationships with believers and non-believers alike. You and your neighbors will develop a sense of community and security where distrust and isolation may have existed before.

Sometimes relationship building as a Christian amounts to planting a faith seed. Often it's easy to insert into your conversations that you attend church. Eventually others will come to know you as a person of God. You never know when months or years later that reticent, put-off neighbor asks, "Didn't you say you go to Creekside Church?" That person very well could be asking, "Tell me more about your faith." He or she could be in a place where prayer is needed.

God created us in His image to support, encourage, and befriend those around us. We have a shared existence with those who live next door, across, or down the street. They are a blessing to us as we are a blessing to them.

Even better, we don't have to wait until the next flooded street to get to know them. It starts with God and a smile.

Long gone are the days of knowing our neighbors. Studies show that only an estimated 31 percent of Americans know their neighbors.

This used to be the fabric of American neighborhoods. Before the inventions of the television, air conditioning and computers, most Americans sat on their front porches after eating a good home cooked family dinner.

...only an estimated 31% of Americans know their neighbors. The porch was the catalyst in helping people know their neighbors. The more frequently a neighbor saw you on the porch, the greater the chance to engage in social interactions. The porch would offer ways to invite a neighbor for coffee or invite their children to play with yours.

od has been moving mightily at Creekside throughout our 94 year history—no mistake about that! And one constant along the way has been our heritage of Godly leaders who constantly ask "how can we better reach our community with the gospel?" This is what led a German Baptist Church eventually to become First Baptist Church in the '40s and finally Creekside Christian Church a few years ago.

This is what moved our church from the outskirts of Franklin to the heart of Elk Grove, and then years later, from that Old Town Elk Grove location to our current site. Since then we've seen the city grow up around us, and God bring people to faith in Him in droves.

Since 2000, however, we've seen trends of bumping up against our capacity ceiling for Sunday services over and over again... but we've never been able to break through it. So, four years ago we began tackling the question of how to accommodate the growth that God was bringing to Creekside. This has taken us on a journey of launching a service wherein we could accommodate hundreds more Jesus-seekers for weekend services and other events.

Enter the Venue, a newly renovated space and an excitingly distinct worship experience coming to Creekside in early 2019.

In the Venue we'll show the same sermon for weekend services via video partnered with live music and worship elements alongside it in a fresh, new environment. The music will be electric-driven, bumping loud, and usher you in to reflecting on the greatness of our God. You'll be greeted with ridiculous hospitality through new Guest Services teams that are being launched, enjoy free pastries from different cultures, and have the option of sipping espresso or tea from the Café. Among the varied seating options are higher bar stools in the side alcoves and the Family Room in the back which will welcome in those with young children so families can worship together.

So, the question everyone wants answered: what's the status on the Venue launch? The renovation

was completed in mid-November and A/V fully installed in mid-December. Our worship band has been preparing for months and we have dozens of new volunteers stepping up to serve with our Guest Services teams—including Parking, Greeters, Ushers, Café, Connection Center, and Prayer & Care. The first events in the Venue will take place in December and we'll spend the rest of December and January preparing for our Grand Opening weekend on January 27.

Our team, led by Mike Harding over construction and Scott Hallman over all things worship and tech, has done a phenomenal job bringing this vision into reality. Now that lights are in and the stage is

set, we are praying God will use this space to reach our community, bringing hundreds into a saving and growing relationship with Him. And you can join us in this work:

- Pray for God to lead us forward and bring new faces who need His salvation.
- Invite your friends and neighbors to experience God's love and grace through the Venue@Creekside.
- Volunteer with one of our Guest Services teams either with the Venue or ongoing worship services.

Why raise kids in a faith-based Holiday atmosphere?

hrist at the Center of Christmas. Sometimes the baby lying in a manger becomes just another decoration in the midst of the noise at Christmas time. Now don't get me wrong I love the rest of the noise.

I love the lights, I love decorating the tree, and I especially love eating the Christmas cookies. I even enjoy that Jolly Old Elf we call Santa Claus.

But in the midst of the noise, how do we quiet it all down to focus on Jesus as the center of Christmas?

One of my mentors tells the story of growing up in a very conservative Christian home in New England.

One Christmas, someone gave him a plastic Santa Claus on skis with lollipops in Santa's bag.

He knew his mother would not approve, so he hid the Santa under his bed.

The next day he looked for the Santa and found it missing.

He knew his mother must have found it, and he feared he might be severely disciplined.

He walked out into the living room and to his amazement when he looked at the crèche he saw his Santa lined up with the shepherds and the wise men.

Santa was skiing to the manger. That simple act by his mother had taught him that Christ is at the center of Christmas; that everyone else, even Santa, needs to come and worship the Christ child.
