Prayer

Digging Deep

- 1. Thinking back on Sunday's message, what idea or lesson stood out to you the most?
- 2. **Read John 12:9-11** from last week's message. Who were the types of people in the crowd looking for Jesus? What kind of environment was Jesus walking into?
- 3. For those that believed in Jesus, what significance did His entry into the city of Jerusalem symbolize? What were the people hoping for?
- 4. Read John 12:12-13 and Psalm 118:25-26. What does "Hosanna" mean? What are the people expecting of Jesus? Had you been there, what would you likely be feeling: fanaticism, fickleness, faith, or fear?

Digging Deeper

5. Read John 12:14-15 and Zechariah 9:9. What is the significance of Jesus arriving to town on a donkey? What does that say about the character of Jesus?

- 6. Read John 12:16. Jesus was fulfilling Jewish prophecy in the midst of the nation that was awaiting their Messiah, yet the disciples and many others still did not understand who Jesus was. Even after all of His miracles, why were so many people still confused about who Jesus was? How do we as Christians confuse who He is even today?
- 7. **Read John 12:17-19**. The power of Jesus raising Lazarus to life caused people to spread the news about what He had done, and more people continued to meet Him. How can we follow this example of faith in the salvation that Jesus provides?
- 8. The Pharisees saw the same miracles that the believers did, yet continued to plot against Jesus. How does this scene eventually lead to Jesus' crucifixion?

Taking It Home

- 9. Those who understood that Jesus was King and Savior were joyous in receiving His entry! As proclaimed followers of Christ, how can we share that same joy in the arrival of Jesus as we follow Him?
- 10. There were many that saw the actions of Jesus, yet still did not understand who He was. How can we ensure that we are accurately understanding the person that Jesus is, and that we are responding to Him accordingly?
