meaning, hope, and happiness that only God himself can give,
they will eventually fail to deliver and break our hearts."

LifeGroup Discussion Questions / Week of Mar 30 – Apr 5, 2025

Prayer

Begin with a prayer of gratitude with thanks for the gifts that God has given us.

Digging Deep

- 1. Reflecting on Sunday's message, what caught your attention?
- 2. Take an inventory of your wants and aspirations that you think about on a regular basis. Are the majority of these items material or immaterial? Consider sharing your list with your LifeGroup.
- 3. Read James 1:9-11. What is the "high position" that James is referencing here? How does James turn the assumed status of the rich and poor upside down? How does this impact your perspective of the pursuit of material things?

Digging Deeper

- 4. **Read James 1:12.** Why is perseverance so important in the Christian life? What is the crown of life?
- 5. **Read James 1:13-15.** Trace the progression in these verses from temptation to death. How do you see this progression play out in your life or with those around you?

- 6. Why do you think we have a tendency to blame God for our temptations (disordered loves), rather than take responsibility for our own sin? What have you found helpful in dealing with temptation personally or in your family?
- 7. Read James 1:16-18 and Matthew 7:9-11. What are the "good gifts" that God gives to us? Are these different or similar to the desires and wants you think of on a regular basis? How has the Lord blessed you with good gifts this year?

Taking It Home

- 8. Read 1 Timothy 6:17-19. How can we "do good" according to Christ Jesus? Of the things listed, which area could use your attention?
- 9. Take another look at your personal inventory of wants and aspirations as listed in #2. Spend time in prayer with the Lord concerning your list. Is there a material want that you can prayerfully exchange for an eternal reward?
